2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

A YEAR OF PROGRESS

I hope you had a great year! We did and are glad to report that we made more progress and reached more people in 2024 than we have any other year. While I still miss both my bank and Master Gardener families, it seems the transition out of full-time employment is paying off.

SPRING 2024

Asparagus and strawberries continue to be popular spring favorites at the local grocery store, JTA Foods and Grill. In fact, we haven't been able to keep up with the local demand. To increase yields for 2025, we built two hugelkultur beds and transplanted a couple hundred strawberry plants. We are constantly experimenting with methods that are sustainable for the environment and our business. The hugelkultur beds are constructed with a layer of rotting wood, sticks, leaves, grass clippings, and compost. As it ages, it will naturally decompose and be full of rich nutrients for the plants. It also sequesters carbon, retains moisture, and is a natural raised bed.... which means back-breaking savings coming in 2025!



THE GREENHOUSE

A majority of our business focuses on salsa and Bloody Mary Mix sales, our value-added products. The greenhouse continues to mitigate costs and gives us a head start on annual transplants that we need, including Roma tomato, green pepper, and jalapeno. It's always fun caring for the little sprouts, watching them grow, and is a great way for the whole family to get involved!
